93 Bus Service - petition

I have been asked by a parent to share information regarding a petition they have created to try and reinstate the above bus service back to its pre-pandemic timetable of every 20 minutes, instead of the current schedule of once every hour. Their reasonings for this are below:

"I have created a petition to reinstate the 93 bus service back to its pre-pandemic timetable of every 20 minutes. I believe there has been an increase of traffic in Dorking due to parents like myself, unable to get their children to school since this service was cut to one bus an hour. Very often children are left stranded at bus stops due to the bus being full to capacity and driving straight past them. This makes your young adults late for school which impacts their education. Many pupils of the Priory use this service and they are often left out in the cold evenings waiting for this bus that doesn't even arrive sometimes. If they have an after school detention, they miss their bus home and have to wait a very long time for the next.

This bus service is vital to low income families and our elderly and disabled community.
